- 1. Nomination by sending institution (Student's application will only be accepted if they have been previous officially nominated by the sending Institution)
- 2. Student: Fill in the on-line application and attach admission documents
- **3.** After application approval, the International Office will send a "Letter of Acceptance" to the student or institution depending on the program.

Application documents

- 1. A copy of the printed on-line application signed and stamped by your home university
- 2. <u>Learning agreement</u> signed by the student and the Academic Coordinator at home university
- 3. Transcript of records
- **4.** A photocopy of your passport or ID
- **5.** Temporary Accommodation Reservation Form

- 15th November 2016: 2nd semester (spring semester) students
