This workspace overlooks the East River and has magnificent views of the Manhattan skyline, wifi, and locally produced power. The facility is owned and operated by the tree itself,* acting as your landlord. Your tenancy generates rent-proceeds to be used by and for the interests of your landlord tree as the tree determines for example: augmenting soil with biochar, companion plantings, and other actions at the tree's discretion.
